

Transition Work

How many elders? How many deacons?

One of the hallmarks of Presbyterian churches is they are governed by elected officers. Every year a nominating committee of the congregation selects people to serve as elders and as deacons to be the primary decision makers in the church. These men and women are then elected by the congregation to serve for 3-year terms. As they begin service the class elected 3 years before rotates off. The officers make practically all the decisions for the church other than a few items that require a congregational vote (like sale of property or changes in the by-laws) or that are left to the discretion of pastors (like particulars in a worship service).

How many officers are needed? That depends on the size of the congregation and the complexity of the ministries in which the church engages. The number is also impacted by how many other leadership positions there are in the church. For example, First Presbyterian Church of High Point is blessed to have an active Presbyterian Women organization. Many of those leaders would make a great elder or deacon but might prefer not to try to fill more than one key role.

How the boards are organized is another element to consider. One of the challenges at First Presbyterian that exists is that sometimes there are communication breakdowns between the Session (Board of Elders) and the Diaconate (Board of Deacons) or between different committees. Long-Range Planning has presented a plan to the two boards to consider a unified board structure (one single board) along with an attempt to better organize the committees of the boards.

No decisions have been made yet and the boards will consider this along with a possible reduction in number of officers this fall. The boards will experiment for a bit before deciding by living with the proposal and seeing if it is practical.

Why does this matter for the time of transition? Having good communication between committees, having officer classes of a size that the Officer Nominating Committee can fill, and having board(s) that can effectively manage the church ministries are all signs of a church where members know who they are and what they can accomplish. This is the kind of work that can be described in a mission study that will make the church more attractive for prospective pastors.

Session Calls for Congregational Meeting on July 13 Following 11 am Worship

The Session has called for a congregational meeting following the 11 am service on **July 13**. The Officer Nominating Committee will deliver a slate of officers for the congregation's vote. The committee selected 8 members, 4 to serve as elders and 4 to serve as deacons. These numbers are more in line with the plans that Long Range Planning presented to streamline both boards.

Those selected for Elder for the class of 2028 are Jim Caress, Mary Fraley, Betsy Hunt and David Perry. The Deacons for class of 2028 are Judy Deal, Heidi Hans, Ed Henriques and Janice Kubinksi. In addition, the committee asked Susan Osborne and Will Allen to shift their tenures to the class of 2026 on the board of Deacons. With these additions and changes there are now 4 officers in each three-year class on both boards for a total of 12 Elders and 12 Deacons.

Christ Caring for People through People


